PROGRAM REPORT – FEBRUARY AND MARCH by Annette Shimer

At the January meetings, I asked for topics and issues that our members wanted to look at in February and March. There were many great suggestions and in the next two months, we will address two of them: Shale and Cybersecurity.

February Unit Meetings – Update on Shale Issues in Our Region with Heather Harr

League member Heather Harr is the project manager for the LWVPA "Straight Scoop about Shale" project. Straight Scoop sponsors an annual conference at Pitt and other events that many of us attend. However, there is much more to this story and its impact on our region. Other experts will join Heather to update us on how the ethane cracker plant being built in Beaver County will impact our air and health, what's happening with the storage hub, drilling at the Edgar Thompson works, and the role of the Pittsburgh Presbytery. In the little-known facts portion, you can expect to learn about the ethane to plastics to ocean pollution highway. It's all happening here.

March Unit Meetings – Voting System Technology and Cyber Security with Ron Bandes

Voting, in all its aspects, is our greatest concern. Most of us are concerned about the aging voting equipment used in Allegheny County and want to see it replaced with....well what do we want? League member Ron Bandes has some guidelines. Locally he is part of VoteAllegheny and has made presentations to the PA Legislature's Committee on Voting System Technology with a primary focus on cybersecurity. While this will be the major topic in Ron's presentation, he will likely respond to your questions about voting machines.

Two meaty topics. Check out the weekly BLAST for updates on invited guests. Conflict on the date? You can attend any of the three meetings and bring a friend or relative with you.

“Spring has sprung”....a line from a poem in elementary school. I often think of that line while hoping spring will be here....SOON! Our members don't wait for spring to come to Make Democracy Work.

I am sure all of us have had to miss out on an event or meeting that we were interested in attending due to such things as childcare, conflicting family events, work, transportation issues and sometimes something as simple as bad weather. The League has started livestreaming our voter forums to help those unable to attend a forum in person view the candidates at a forum.

Thanks to Steve Clack, a documentary filmmaker (and son of our voter chair, Judy Clack), we have been able to live stream our forums to our Facebook page. We are able to reach a larger audience through live streaming during the forum, and after the forum through folks viewing the videos of the forum on our Facebook page. The League needs your help to run these forums, and also your help to make sure others in our communities know about the livestreaming.

When the forums are held, we need individuals onsite doing tasks such as greeting the public, handing out cards for audience questions, timing answers by the candidates, sorting questions for the candidates, moderating the forum, and running the camera (actually a cellphone that is making a video). We have instructions for all the helpers, and always a member who is in charge of the crew for the night who knows

what all the tasks are, and who is performing which tasks. If transportation is an issue, please let us know – there may be a carpool going or we may be able to get you a carpool for another evening. If you are hesitant to help because you have not done this before, or don't want to be on camera, please don't let that hold you back. Most of the jobs are done as part of a team and you won't be on camera – we are focusing on the candidates!

We will have forums coming up for elections later this year and will need your help. The forums are announced on our Facebook page and in the weekly blast and, depending on lead time, in the Voter. For the forums to work successfully, we need volunteers to work that evening, and we need everyone to get the word out. If there will be a forum in your community and you are not able to help that evening, please get the word out that a forum will be livestreamed and available later in the video section of our Facebook page. Let parents who need to be home with children know, college students who attend school away from home and will be voting absentee know, people who can't attend due to transportation or mobility problems know, people who work evenings and cannot attend know,in other words let all the voters you know in that community know! One of the great things about the livestreaming and subsequent online video is the ability to watch the forum a second time or share it with a friend or relative. Our most recent forum has about 2,400 views!

The PA Supreme Court has declared Pennsylvania's Congressional districts unconstitutional, which is certainly a step in the right direction. But it is important to know that this decision sends the mapping process right back to the legislature that created those maps.

The League must work hard to get an independent commission that does not include politicians, or their staff or relatives, to draw the maps starting in 2021. The first step is to enact SB22 or HB722.

Two LWVGP candidate forums for upcoming Special Elections are scheduled and a third was completed.

(1) **Pittsburgh City Council District 8 Special Election Candidate Forum**, Thurs., Feb. 22, 7 – 9 pm, JCC of Greater Pittsburgh, 5738 Forbes Ave., 15217. The forum is co-sponsored by LWVGP with the Jewish Community Center of Greater Pittsburgh and the Squirrel Hill Urban Coalition. The Special Election is on Tues., Mar. 6 to fill Dan Gilman's seat.



(2) **U. S. Congressional District 18 Special Election Candidate Forum**, Sat., Mar. 3, 7 – 8 pm, broadcast live on WTAE-TV. It will also be live streamed on WTAE's website as well as available thereafter for viewing on their website: <http://www.wtae.com>. The Special Election is Tues., Mar. 13 to fill Tim Murphy's seat. This election will be followed by a Primary for the same seat on Tues., May 15.

(3) **PA House District # 35 Special Election Candidate Forum** was held on Mon., Jan. 8, 6:30 – 7:30 pm, Carnegie Library of Homestead, 510 East 10th Ave., Munhall, 15120. The forum drew more than 65 people on a wintry evening. Thanks Carnegie Library of Homestead and to LWVGP members Ron Bandes, Cris Beuger, Judy Clack, Phyllis Dreyfuss, Heather Harr, Michele Knoll, Doug Krings, Jessica Lynch, Eileen Olmsted, and Annette Shimer who made this forum so successful. FUNDRAISING SUCCESS! by Preston Shimer



Each year as part of LWVGP's budget development process, our Treasurer and the Budget committee make some educated guesses about how much we'll receive in revenue from dues, member and non-member contributions, memorial gifts and contributions to the Ed Fund. Some of these items, like dues, can be projected fairly accurately based on history but other categories like memorial gifts can vary significantly from year to year and are much harder to predict.

As the 2017 calendar year wore on, it became clear that our expenses were going to outpace our planned-for revenue unless we made an End-of-the-Year Appeal, which we did. And, **WOW!** League members and non-members came through in a big, big way. Here's the summary of what has happened as well as some significant highlights:

Of the \$32,511 we budgeted for this fiscal year from the various categories mentioned above, we have now received \$25,505. In addition, we have received a \$3300 grant due to the efforts of Eileen Olmstead; that grant can be counted toward our \$32,511 goal. As a result of the generosity of both League and non-League members, we are within \$4,000 of meeting our non-dues requirements for this fiscal year. As we said, **WOW!**

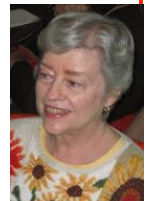
Although we've listed everyone who contributed by category at the end of this report (see the next page), it's important to highlight some very significant donations:

- Marilyn Skolnick, a long time and very active League member, included the League in her estate, and, as a result, we received \$6,414.
- The friends and family of Trudy Rose have also been very generous to the League because of the value Trudy placed on the League and our activities. So far, we've received \$3,875 due to Trudy's influence. Her husband and son each donated \$1000.
- Richard and Joyce Chalfant donated \$5,000.
- Martha Smith donated \$1000 in honor of Sue Broughton.
- Phyllis Armstrong continued to donate \$1000 for Facts for Citizens.
- Nancy Bernstein donated \$1000 in appreciation for our work.

On January 3, LWVUS President Chris Carson issued the following statement in response to President Trump's Executive Order terminating his "election integrity" commission:

"Today voters win. We are pleased that the Trump Administration has at last dissolved their discredited 'election integrity' commission.

"As has been said time and time again, the purpose of this effort was to justify President Trump's false claims of widespread voter fraud in the 2016 elections. This travesty; of a commission was nothing more than a tactic of voter suppression and an unnecessary distraction from legitimate threats to our democracy.

"It is now time for our leaders to focus on the very real work of securing our elections against foreign interference, while making sure all eligible voters are free to exercise their right to vote"
