Get Ready to Vote! PA General Election November 8, 2022

Who Is Eligible to Vote?

- All US citizens ages 18 or older as of November 8, 2022
- PA residents for 30 days prior to November 8, 2022

What Are the Deadlines?

Postmarks do not count! MAIL EARLY!

- October 24th: Last day to register to vote
- November 1st: Last day to apply for mail-in or absentee ballot
- November 8th: Election Day. Vote in person 7am-8pm
- November 8th: Mail-In or absentee ballots must be received by 8pm

Choose federal and state candidates that will make decisions that affect your daily life.

Who Will Be on My Ballot?

- A US Senator and all US House of Representatives to Congress
- Pennsylvania Governor and Lieutenant Governor
- Some PA State Senators and all PA State Representatives

Your Vote is Your Voice PA General Election November 8, 2022



- You can register either **online** at <u>Vote.PA.gov</u> or **on paper**.
- If you have a PA Driver's License or PennDOT ID, you can **register online** using just your PA License or ID number for identification. If you do not have a PA Driver's License or ID, you can register online by using the last four digits of your Social Security Number and uploading a photo of your signature. Or, complete and sign a paper application.
- Download and print a **paper registration** form at <u>Vote.PA.gov</u> or request one from your local county elections office or the League of Women Voters office.
- If you change your name, address, or party, you must update your registration at <u>Vote.PA.gov</u> or on a paper registration application.

How Do I Vote by Mail?

1. APPLY:

- Complete a **Ballot Request Application** for either an Absentee Ballot or No-Excuse Mail-In Ballot either online or on paper. Do this as soon as possible.
- Go to <u>Vote.PA.gov</u> and either complete the application online or download and print the application. If you have a PA Driver's License or PennDOT ID, you can apply online using just your PA License or ID number for identification. If you do not have a PA Driver's License or ID, you can apply online by using the last four digits of your Social Security Number and uploading a photo of your signature. Or, complete and sign a paper application.
- Contact the **Allegheny County Division of Elections** or **League of Women Voters** office for an application.

2. VOTE:

- Your Mail-in Ballot or Absentee Ballot will be mailed to you once ballots are printed.
- Check the status of your Ballot at <u>Vote.PA.Gov/mailballotstatus</u>. "Pending" status means your application is approved and your ballot will be mailed once printed.
- **Complete your Absentee or Mail-In Ballot** and mail it to the Allegheny County Elections Division to be received by November 8th at 8 pm.
- Insert your ballot in the **secrecy envelope** and seal it. Make no marks on the secrecy envelope. Insert the secrecy envelope into the **official return envelope**, seal it, sign it, and enter today's date. Then mail it immediately. It must be <u>received</u> by 8 pm on November 8.

How Do I Vote in Person?

- Polls are open from **7 am-8 pm** on Election Day, **November 8th**.
- Bring voter registration card or another valid ID.
- Don't leave without voting. Any registered voter may request a provisional ballot.
