State Judiciary

The PA Constitution, as amended January 1, 1969, provides for a unified judicial system. The judicial officers are nominated at primary elections and elected at municipal elections, which occur in odd-numbered years. A judge who has completed a full elected term of 10 years may qualify for retention election. The candidate's name appears on the ballot in November without political party designation. The voters indicate by voting "yes" or "no" whether that candidate shall be retained as a judge for an additional 10-year term. The Governor makes appointments to fill any vacancies that occur; the Senate confirms. Appointed judges must then stand for election, usually at the next municipal election. Pennsylvania judges must retire at age 75.

Qualifications for Voters

- 1. You must be a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You must be at least 18 years of age on the day of the election.
- 3. You must be a resident of Allegheny County and of your election district for 30 days.

You can get a **paper Voter Registration Application** from the Allegheny County Elections Division, at some public libraries, at the League of Women Voters Office, or it can be downloaded at VotesPA.com.

Closed Primaries and Party Registration

Pennsylvania is a closed primary state. You may or may not choose to be affiliated with a political party. However, your party registration affects how you may vote in primary elections.

- In a **primary election** in Pennsylvania, only voters registered as members of either the Democratic or Republican party may vote for candidates of their own party.
- Occasionally there is a ballot question, referendum, or special election on the primary ballot. All voters may vote on these.
- In a **November (general) election**, any registered voter may vote for any candidate of any political party.

Mail-in and Absentee Voting (PA Act 77 of 2019 authorized "no-excuse" mail-in ballots.)

- A mail-in ballot may be used by any registered voter.
- An **absentee ballot** may be used by registered voters who expect to be away from their municipality on election day due to college, work or vocation, or who are ill or incapacitated. (*This option was retained due to the wording regarding "absentee ballots" in the Pennsylvania State Constitution.*)

Mail-in and Absentee Voting (cont.)

There are three steps to secure and return a mail-in or absentee ballot:

- 1. Request Application: Go to <u>VotesPA.com</u> and complete the online mail-in or absentee ballot application. For a paper application, download, print, and mail the paper application. Or call 412-350-4500 to request a paper application.
- 2. Complete and Return Application: Return paper mail-in or absentee ballot application to: Allegheny County Elections Division, 542 Forbes Avenue, Suite 609, Pittsburgh PA 15219
- 3. Complete and Return Mail-in Ballot: When you receive your mail-in or absentee ballot, mark the ballot following the directions *exactly*. Voted mail-in or absentee ballots must be returned to your County Elections Division and RECEIVED by 8pm on election day.

Be an Active, Informed Voter

Know your candidates at election time. The LWVPGH provides these services.

- **Online**: Go to <u>Vote411.org</u> to get nonpartisan, comprehensive information about the candidates on your own ballot.
- Print: The Voters Guide is compiled by the LWVPGH and published in *The New Pittsburgh Courier* newspaper on Wednesday, two weeks prior to each Primary and General Election. The guide lists the candidates with their biographies and views. Copies can be found in local public libraries. A PDF copy of the printed Voters Guide will be available online at lwvpgh.org.

When You Call or Write, Do It Right:

- Address your officials correctly.
- Identify yourself as a constituent.
- Be polite and brief.
- State your position on the subject clearly.
- Refer to the name or number of a bill, if applicable. (Voting Rights Bill, House Bill 23)
- Request action. Ask for an answer.
- Thank them for good votes.
