RETURNING CITIZENS and Citizens with a Criminal Record

KNOW THE FACTS: With Only a Few Exceptions YOU MAY REGISTER and VOTE!

If you are ELIGIBLE (see below) and you meet these qualifications, you may REGISTER and VOTE: 1) you have been a US citizen for at least one month before the next election; 2) you have lived in Pennsylvania and in your election district for at least 30 days before the next election; 3) you will be at least 18 years of age on the day of the next election.

Your Vote is Your Voice!

FELONY CHARGE/CONVICTION In Pennsylvania, people

In Pennsylvania, people charged or convicted of a FELONY, who have served their jail terms and are not currently incarcerated, MAY REGISTER AND VOTE.

*EXCEPTIONS BELOW



PRE-TRIAL DETAINEES

People who are incarcerated while awaiting trial on charges of a misdemeanor or a felony charge, MAY REGISTER and VOTE.



MISDEMEANORS

People who are incarcerated for or were ever convicted of MISDEMEANORS MAY REGISTER and VOTE.



PAROLE OR PROBATION

People who are on PROBATION, or are released on PAROLE, including those in halfway houses*, whether they had been charged with a misdemeanor or a felony, MAY REGISTER and VOTE.

People who are under HOUSE ARREST for a misdemeanor or a felony MAY REGISTER AND VOTE.

*FELONY CHARGE--MAY NOT Register or Vote: 1) Currently completing a term of incarceration for conviction of a FELONY and will NOT be released until after the next election; 2) Currently placed in a halfway house or alternative correctional facility on pre-release status for conviction of a FELONY and NOT released until after the next election. 3) Convicted of violating any provision of the PA Election Code in the last four years.
